The IFLA IT and IFLA Library Building and Equipment Sections are proud to sponsor a panel discussion and series of global case studies on the topic of technology-enhanced library learning commons, integration with library architectural and spatial design, and new conceptual ideas for learning in the new millennia. The event will focus specifically on digital literacy and new space possibilities for library technology enhanced spaces, commons and centers exploring architectural and information technology (IT) innovation in academic, research, and other types of libraries. Reviewers are open to presentations from all types of libraries working in these areas from both IT and architectural perspectives.

The proposed panel will consist of three or four panelists, each of whom will deliver a 15-minute presentation in English followed by 15 minutes of audience questions. The emphasis of the discussion may range across topics of innovative IT spatial design for libraries and technology enhanced learning environments to new forms of library/IT integrations to micro-credentialing and badging classrooms to new innovative spaces in libraries for digital/information literacy and these new millennia possibilities.

We are particularly interested not only in IT equipment and architectural space but also the larger idea of learning with IT integration in learning environments ranging from digital media centers to data visualization/AI labs, to Digital Preservation, Digitization labs, Immersive Technologies or other possibilities. Strong considerations will be given to innovative architecture, community building, and enabling new learning possibilities in concert with 21st century library digital and algorithmic literacy competencies.

We are keen to receive proposals of innovative library/architecture/technology case studies from around the world to highlight innovation, best-in-class examples, and early-stage projects.. This session is planned jointly between groups with an emphasis on interdisciplinarity and planning regarding IT and architecture and spatial design considerations for present needs and the future.

- Papers / PPTs will be published in IFLA's online Repository following conference
