
- **National University Technology Network Award**: Online Library's Course Guide Project for academic technology innovation (September 2012).

#### \* Finance:





## **ECM2** Project

The number of e-book conversions for Quarter 2 totaled 124. 31 of the texts were automatically triggered by print price inflation. Textbooks continue to reflect the dominant electronic textbook model. Net annual savings are projected at upwards of *\$1,459,000*.
