
- **IMS Global Award for Innovation, Gold**: Online Library's Course Guide Project wins international recognition.





ECM2 Project

ECM launched in early 2007 from a late 2006 planning document. This multiyear effort was designed to stage an orchestrated switch to electronic course materials. It arose from the Online Library's proactive responses to the inflationary price spiral of printed textbooks and shipping costs, but was also designed as a measure to better ensure classroom quality and currency.

The project continues to represent the most sophisticated approach in higher education. ECM operations are coordinated across a tripartite framework: E-textbook conversions (including Open Textbooks), Library/Open Web resources, and APUS ePress commissions. Student acceptance rates for electronic materials are annually surveyed and used to help gauge the speed of conversion. Instructors continue to be the material arbiters for courses, but are assisted by online librarians as information literacy and allied subject specialists. The library's automated Course Guides provide unparalleled methods for sustaining quality and currency.

The number of e-book conversions for Quarter 2 totaled 24. 16 of the courses were automatically triggered by print price inflation. Textbooks continue to reflect the dominant electronic textbook model. Annual savings are projected at upwards of \$788,300.

Announcements

- The American Public University System (APUS) University Archives will host the Panhandle Documentary Heritage Preservation Workshop from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on October 12-13, 2012, at the APUS Academics Center Library in Charles Town.
